JOURNEY TO (WEEK 7)







FAMILY LIFE IS SACRED - Imagine that as you step into your home, it is as if you are stepping into the Church. How may you speak and treat each other... seek and offer forgiveness?

FAMILY ACTIVITY IS HOLY- Just as family life is sacred, the activities that we do inside and outside the home is holy. Knowing this, how may it transform what and how we say or do things everyday?

FAMILIES HAVE A UNIQUE MINISTRY- Consider the many Gifts of each member of the family. Put all these together and you can serve God in a manner unique to your family. How can you use this to be "Church" in the World?



FAMILIES ARE AN EVANGELIZING COMMUNITY- "In what might be regarded as the Domestic Church, the parents are to be the first preachers of the faith for their children by word and example" - Pope Paul VI. We are called to nurture our faith inside the home so we can share it outside the home.
